Subject intent

We follow the *Agreed Syllabus for RE in Surrey Schools*. The curriculum intends to encourage all children (through studying Christianity and other principal religions) to explore their own and others' questions about meaning and purpose in life, beliefs about God, issues of right and wrong and what it means to be human. It supports all children to develop their spiritual, moral, social and cultural development by reflecting on their own beliefs and values whilst respecting the rights of others to differ.

If you were to walk into an RE lesson at The Raleigh you would see: Purposeful, enquiry-based learning, showing curiosity through questioning and making thoughtful responses in an inclusive and respectful environment. Work may be recorded in a range of ways; in RE books and Big Books, including photographs of practical activities, artwork and reflections on class discussions. Children may be exploring ideas as a class, working co-operatively in groups or completing individual tasks with a good level of engagement and interest. Children demonstrate a positive attitude to RE, valuing the opportunity to share their own views and experiences as well as enjoying learning about the beliefs, practices and views of others.
