COMMUNICATION

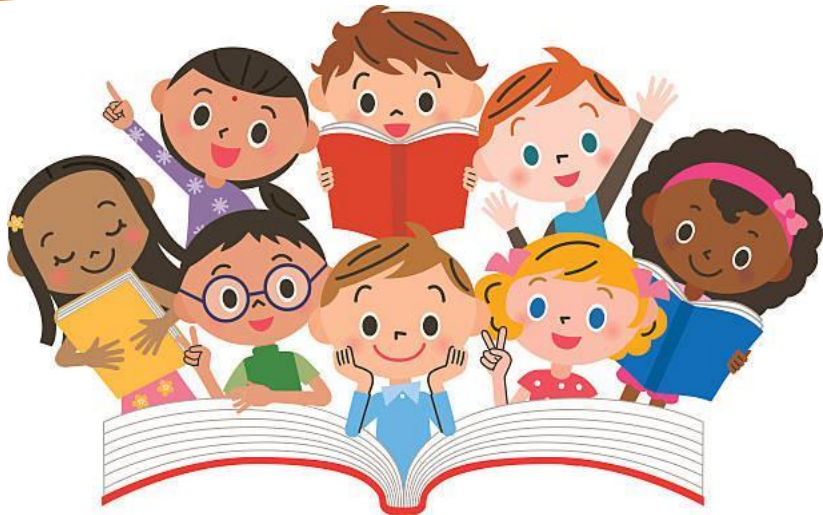

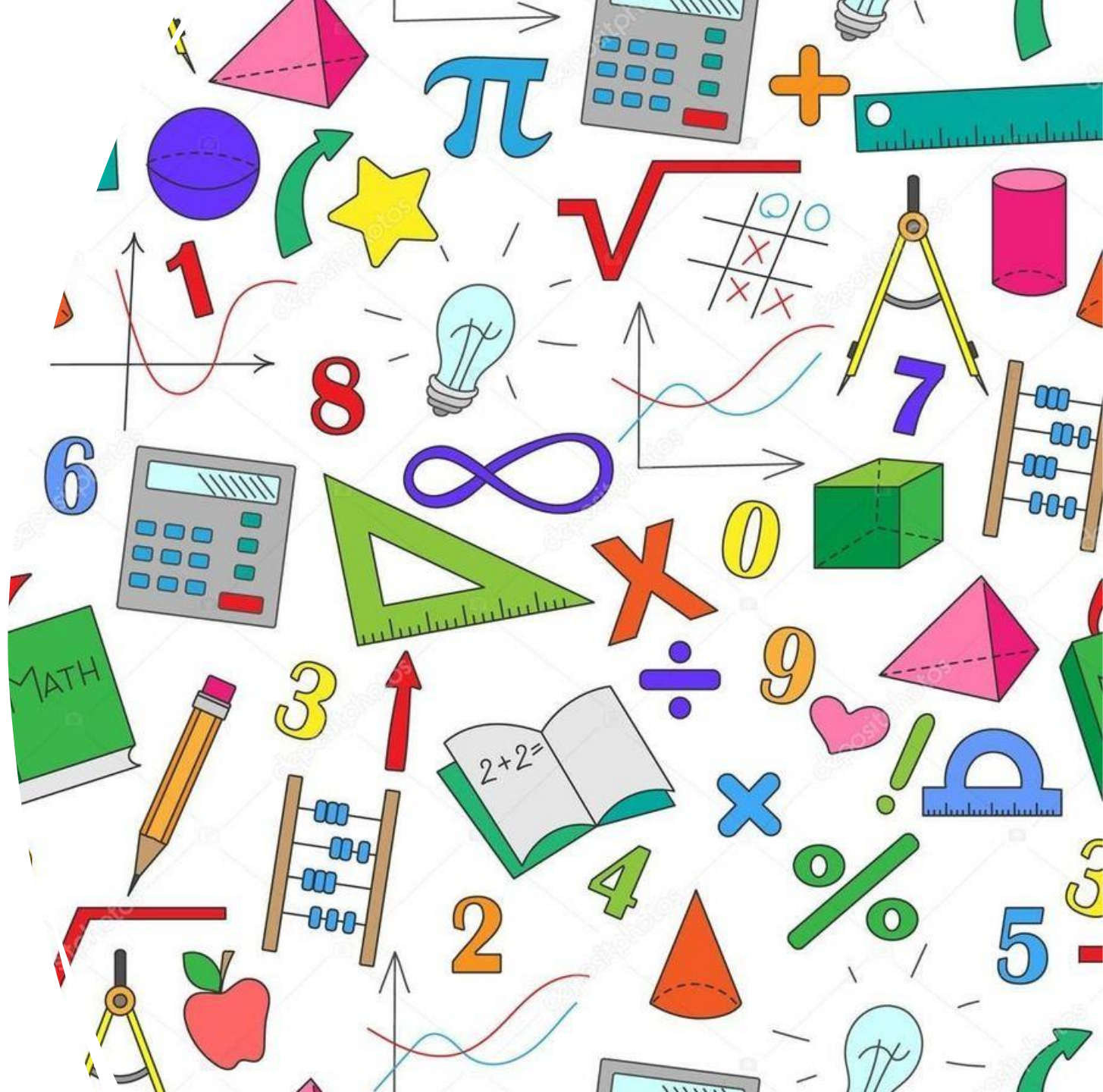
ENGLISH

- Reading – Reading sessions will run weekly on Mondays to help with comprehension and understanding.
- Grammar and spelling – weekly grammar and spelling lesson to revisit all aspects of the KS2 national curriculum
- Writing lessons follow planning, drafting, editing and publishing process



MATHS

- 5 X a week Whole class lessons. 1 of those lessons will have a reasoning and problem-solving focus.
- Lessons revisit all aspects of the KS2 national curriculum to prepare children for their transition to secondary school and beyond
- Introduction of new content:
 - Probability
 - Ratio & proportion
 - Multiplying and dividing fractions
 - Long division
 - Problem solving & reasoning

YEAR 6 HOMEWORK

Homework

The children all have a homework diary with a homework timetable in the front. Homework will be set for 40 minutes, twice a week. Maths will be set on a Monday (due in on Wednesday) and English, or other curriculum area, on a Thursday (due in the following Monday). Weekly spellings will be set on a Friday and tested the following Friday.

All children are expected to read at home and practise their spellings daily, recording their progress in their diaries. Please read the full instructions in the front of your children's homework diaries with them, to ensure they are aware of Year 6 expectations – this will support them enormously for their transition to secondary school.

It is essential that children are completing their homework diary daily and that these are being signed by parents once a week.


These will be checked in school every Monday.

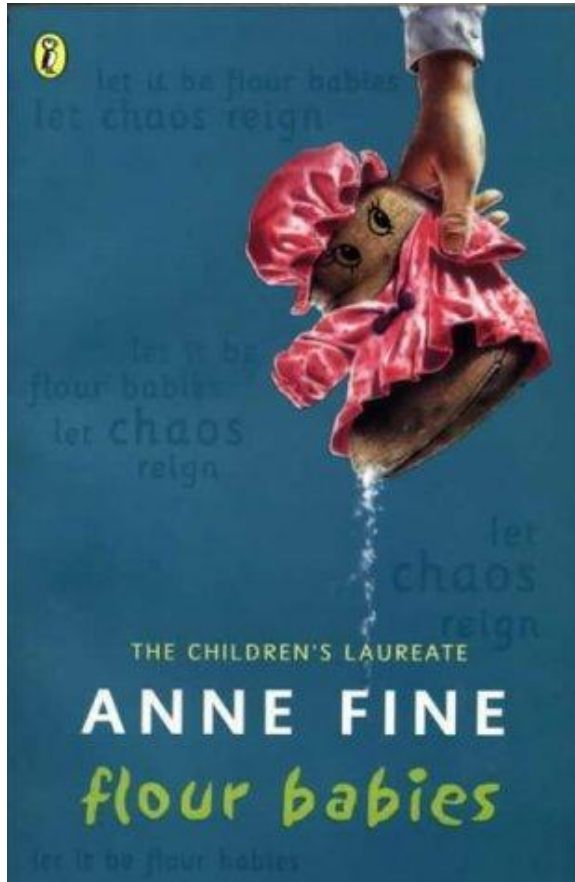
