Children are encouraged to think critically to develop a rigorous understanding of the subject as well as an understanding of how art and design has shaped our history and contributed to the culture, creativity and wealth of our nation.

If you were to walk into an art lesson at The Raleigh you would see: children confidently and enthusiastically discussing and producing high quality pieces of work. They will be engaged with developing new skills and will be demonstrating that they are learning the necessary language to evaluate their own work and the work of others, including peers and well-known artists.
