Until October half term, the children will be provided with all school stationery. After half term, they will be asked to bring in a stocked pencil case. Topic / Art

Our topic this term is Early Britons, which covers the development of civilisation in Britain from 12000 BC to the Iron Age.



There will be a trip to Butser Ancient Farm, on Thursday 14th September, which will really bring this topic to life as the children will experience an archaeological dig and learn to make fences in the traditional Stone Age way!



Art will support our topic work. We will be learning how to create shade and depth through applying different media and methods.

Computing

We will be recapping internet safety rules and looking at different search engines. We will then research topic based facts and explore the use of presentations.

<u>Homework</u>

Homework will be set on Fridays and must be returned by the following Wednesday. The homework consists of a maths task, sheet or Mathletics, personalised spellings and one other piece of work. This final piece tends to be quite informal and often fun! It varies from developing a skill learned in English to researching or building a model for topic or science. We will also encourage the children to regularly log in to their TT Rockstars account. (Their log in details will be in the front of their reading diary.)

Each task should take no longer than 20 minutes; if your child struggles in any way please do send them in with a note.

They will also be required to read at least every week night. Even if they are an independent reader, it is still beneficial for them to read aloud to an adult and for you to discuss the text with them. Please ensure that you sign the Reading Record book when you hear your child read; this should be every day. It will be checked every Monday. Any child who does not have at least three adult signatures during the previous week will be required to attend a reading clinic during Monday morning breaktime.

<u>English</u>

We will continue to develop your child's spelling, punctuation and grammar skills as well as work on their cursive handwriting. The internet and non-fiction texts will be used to work on factual reports as well as for looking at story structures and writing narratives. We will also continue with regular 'Big Writing' sessions. Read Write Inc spelling sessions will take place three times a week and the children will be tested on their individual spellings once a week.

Maths

We will be learning more about place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division and how to apply these to a variety of 'real life' contexts. We aim to develop your child's reasoning skills through regular exposure to reasoning problems as well as weekly problem solving investigations. It would be a great help if you would practise using money with your child at home as they will benefit hugely from being familiar with the value of coins. We will also be working on developing rapid recall of some specific times tables; by the end of the year your child should know their 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 6x 8x and 10x tables and corresponding division facts.

Indoor PE

This will be on Friday for both classes. This term we will be adapting traditional African dance moves and will also explore different jumping techniques.

<u>Outdoor PE</u>

This will be on a Monday afternoon. They will get muddy and wet sometimes, so old trainers are better than plimsolls.

It is important that your child keeps their named trainers in school everyday.

<u>Science</u>

In science, we will be looking at how rocks are formed, different soils and fossils. After half term we will then learn about animals, humans and healthy eating.
