Homework:

Wednesday: 20 minutes' maths homework relating to the current or previous week's class work to be handed in on Friday. 'Mathletics' or 'Times Table Rock Stars' web-based tasks may sometimes be set as a homework. Children also need to be practising times tables at home to support school learning.

Friday: 20 minutes' English/topic or science to be handed in the following Wednesday. The children will have a list of key spellings for you to practise with them (they should write them out in the red homework book). These will be tested every Friday.

Reading: The children should be reading at home daily. This may include independent reading for more confident readers. Please make a signed note of your child's reading in the Reading Record (a minimum of 3 times a week). Reading Records will be checked every Monday and any children without the necessary signatures will need to stay in at break time to read.

Times tables: The children will be expected to practise their times tables regularly. Times Tables Rockstars is a great online resource that the children love - please focus on using the Soundcheck feature! We will be monitoring this regularly to see the children's progress.

The Curriculum:

In English this term we will be studying Lewis Carroll's Alice in Wonderland stories and a range of literature from other genres. The reading we will be doing will form the basis for creative writing, drama, research skills, grammar, comprehension and punctuation.

This term, in maths, we will be focussing on place value, addition and subtraction, geometry and using and applying maths. We will be encouraging the children to solve calculations efficiently using both mental and written methods.

Our topic is about the history of Guildford and the Industrial Revolution; this will include map work as well as our fabulous trip to Guildford.

In Science, we will be studying electricity and sound.

It is very important that you keep us up to date with any changes in personal details and circumstances so that both parents, in case of separation, for example, can receive all communications about their children.
