Basic equipment for everyday

What we will learn this term

English: We will be using our trip to Osmington Bay to inspire writing in the genres of persuasive leaflets and letters. We will also study a range of other genres including suspense stories and poetry (The Highwayman).

Maths: As we build our knowledge in the all areas of maths, we will particularly apply our understanding to problemsolving and reasoning activities.

Geography: Our study of coastal areas in the United Kingdom, drawing heavily on our first-hand experiences gained in Lulworth Cove and Durdle Door. We will later investigate the impact of volcanic eruptions, focussing upon an eruption in Hiemaey, Iceland.

Science: The topics for science this term are lifecycles and the reproductive processes of plants, animals and humans.

PSHE: This half term, we will be learning how to manage our online relationships safely. Next half term, we will teach our RSE unit.

Other subjects: Our other learning will include the study of Islam in RE (including our visit to the mosque), recorder playing in music and orienteering and athletics in PE.
