TOPIC

Our topic for this term is 'Amazing Animals.' This will include learning about animals' needs and different ways of categorising them. Then we will move on to humans as part of the animal kingdom. This will include learning about parts of the body and how we grow. There will be lots of hands-on science activities so it will be great fun.



In addition, as ongoing science and history themes for the year, we will be studying the changing seasons and important historical figures. This will lead us into celebrating winter festivals such as Bonfire Night, Hanukkah and, of course, Christmas. English

The children will be completing many writing activities this term. We will be looking at different forms of narrative writing, simple labels and captions and looking at the structure of a sentence so that we can write short stories as well as non-fiction pieces. As part of the National Curriculum we will be focussing more on learning to recognise and use capital letters and being able to spell the days of the week. Our word level work will focus on consolidating all basic sounds and looking at initial blends during our 'Letters & Sounds' sessions 3 times a week. We will also focus on developing a neat, cursive style of handwriting during weekly handwriting sessions.



Homework

The children will not bring home formal homework that needs to be returned and marked. Each term we will send home a pack that will inform you of things the children should practise at home and ideas for activities and websites that you can use. The children will, of course, need to continue to read for 10 minutes every day. Please record this daily in your child's Reading Record. If there is little evidence of your child reading daily they will have to stay in at break time to catch up on missed reading time.

Please encourage your child to use the Mathematics website at home. Your child's login details will be supplied in due course.

School Library

The school library is currently closed so we will not be using the school library at the moment, so we will be using our class library to exchange books.

Please return any school library books you may have at home.

P.E

Year 1 will have outdoor P.E (weather permitting) on Friday afternoons and indoor PE on Wednesday mornings.

The children will not be required to wear their PE kits in autumn 1.


However, they should still have plimsolls or trainers in school every day for PE and also if they wish to use the Adventure playground at afternoon play.

Maths

This term we will be practising counting, reading and writing numbers to 20 in digits and words. We will be working on place value, addition and subtraction. We will develop mental arithmetic skills, for example saying the number more or less than a given number. There will be practical activities on length and shape.
