Dear families,

A very big welcome to Year 2 from all of us! We hope that the children will soon settle into their new routines and enjoy all the excitement we have planned for them this term.

Hopefully this newsletter will give you some information for the coming term but if you have any other questions please do not hesitate to ask any of the Year 2 Team.

TOPIC



This half term's topic is 'London' - focussing on both geography and history. We will be looking at the River Thames from its source to the mouth and the various landmarks along it that have helped London become such a tourist attraction. On the historical side we will be finding out how and why the Great Fire of London started and about the lives of Samuel Pepys, Sir Christopher Wren and Florence Nightingale. If you have any resources that you think will be useful for our topics, please do send them in but name them first! After half term we will study the 'Victorians' covering aspects of Queen Victoria's life, Victorian toys and of course, we will be enjoying a traditional Victorian school day complete with very strict teachers - date and more information to follow.

Trips/Visits

On **Friday 28th September** we will be visiting London. The trip will include a workshop at the Tower of London and a riverboat cruise. More details to follow.

During the second half of the term we will receive a visit from an important person related to our Victorian topic. The children will need a costume for the Victorian day on **Friday 30th November**.



English

The children will be completing lots of writing activities this term. There will be specific units focusing on writing stories, instructions, poetry and information texts.

In addition, over the course of the term, we will also focus on topic related texts, speaking and listening activities and drama.

Spelling—Children will be sent home with spellings to practise and learn each week. We will then assess them and record how they did in their reading record. Please ensure that these spellings are practised every week.



Reading

Daily individual reading at home is crucial for your child's development. We appreciate that it is difficult to fit everything in, but it really is of huge benefit to your child. **Please**

remember to sign, date and comment on your child's reading in their reading diary daily. If we notice that they have not read 5 times in a week, they will be required to attend reading detention with a senior member of staff during Monday break time to catch up. We will check reading diaries every Monday morning.

In Year 2 some of the books are organised by colour, as they were in Year 1. The remainder are organised into wider ability bands which are demarcated by fruit. Your child will bring home either a coloured or a fruit book where they will have access to a range of genres.

Library

Please encourage your child to read and return their school library books on time. Please also remember to get your child to complete the Horsley library challenge if they started it. Also remember to log on to the 'Reading Cloud' - a fantastic library resource.



P.E

We will have outdoor P.E (weather permitting) on a Monday afternoon and indoor PE on a Tuesday morning.

Children need to have a track suit for the cold weather and need plimsolls or trainers in school **every day** if they wish to use the adventure playground/climbing wall.

Please ensure that everything is **named**

including their trainers. We will be doing a PE kit check the second week back and will send home a note of anything missing



Maths

This term we will be building on the work started in Year 1. We will be partitioning numbers into tens and ones adding in 1's, 2's, 5's and 10's to 100, using money to solve addition and subtraction problems as well as working on shape and measures involving using a ruler and learning doubles and halves of numbers.

Children will be taught different mental arithmetic strategies to help them in their work and where possible we will use problem solving situations.

Big Maths Beat That - On Tuesday, children will do a mental maths challenge. Then, on Thursday, they will see if they can beat their score. They can bring their first try home and please help them practise their sums at home.
